


A few weeks before the start of the 2022 season, Team AKKA-ASP is

making up new duos. They will be defending the Pro-AM driver and team titles, and will be out to claim the Silver titles.



The second Pro-AM duo will line up for the first time in the GT4 European


Series. Entered in a double GT4 programme, France and Europe, Eric Debard
